Phase 1 marks protect the institutional identity of G.O.D.S before commercial exposure. All filings with all Priority 1 and Priority 2 filings on the instructions of this document. COB authorisation before proceeding.

PART ONE

Master Filing Schedule — Priority Order

The filing schedule is organised by priority. Priority 1 marks must be filed in Month 1 before any external activity. Priority 2 marks must be filed by Month 6. Priority 3 marks are filed at Phase 2 activation. International expansion follows a phased jurisdiction strategy.
